ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Who can apply?

 Organisations established in EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme can either participate as the coordinator of the project or as a partner organisation. Partnership is a transnational project and involves minimum three organisations from three different EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme

Priorities addressed

- Cooperation Partnerships must address either:
- at least one horizontal priority and/or
- at least one specific priority relevant to the field of education, training, youth and sport that is mostly impacted.





What is CBHE?

CBHE supports the modernisation and development of HEIs and educational systems in the Third Countries not associated to the E+ programme.





CURRENT CONTEXT

- ✓ Supports the relevance, quality, modernisation and responsiveness of Higher Education Institutions for socioeconomic recovery, growth and prosperity.
- ✓ Reacts to recent trends, in particular economic globalisation, but also the recent decline in human development, fragility, and rising social, economic and environmental inequalities exacerbated by the COVID-19 crisis.
- ✓ Aligned with the 'Sustainable Development Goals' (SDGs) and the Paris Agreement.
- ✓ Global interventions that take into account governance, management and the strengthening of higher education's wider economic and social ecosystems.
- ✓ Addresses regional issues, build alliances and coalitions, pilot new approaches and initiatives built on country ownership.
- ✓ Ensures equity, accessibility and inclusion, system strengthening and capacity building, as well as employability transversally across the action.



EXPECTED IMPACT

- Increased participation of HEIs located in remote areas;
- Regional integration and establishment of comparable recognition, <u>quality assurance tools to support</u> <u>academic cooperation</u>, <u>mobility for students</u>, <u>staff and researchers</u>;
- Increased level of digital competence for students and staff;

CAPACITY BUILDING FOR HIGHER EDUCATION

Organisation registration (PIC numbers)

All organisations that seek to be included as a participant in a funding application or wish to apply for an accordiation, must first have engistered in EACEA's Participant Portal. The registration system assigns a unique Participant Identification Code (PIC) to each organisation close on thewe a PIC unimber, it cannot apply for funding or apply for an accreditation. Points to be noted and respected by applicants for funding ONLY

Organisation profile

Some actions require a minimum number of participating organisations in order for the application to be considered eligible. Likewise, some actions require there to be representation from specific countries for the application to be considered eligible. CAPACITY BUILDING FOR HIGHER EDUCATION

HOW TO APLLY?

Applications are processed by the Education, Audiovisual and Culture Executive Agency (EACEA) of the European Commission. The organisation coordinating the Capacity Building project submits the application to EACEA which evaluates and selects the projects.

Organisations wishing to apply for the EACEA action are required to submit their application online to the EACEA using the correct electronic form and including all requested annexes. Applications sent by post, courier service, fax or email will not be accepted.

Application package

The application form is structured in 3 parts:

- □ Part A Administrative Forms Contains general information about the project, data on the applicant organisation and contact persons
- □ Part B* Technical description & annexes Contains the narrative part of the project, the work packages, milestones & deliverables. Detailed budget table is an annex of Part B
- □ Part C Administrative forms Tick boxes related to the proposal's general objective(s) and indicators specific to the CBHE action (N° of impacted students, N° of new study programmes, N° of involved/trained staff, etc.)





REQUIREMENTS OF EMJM





At application stage EMJM proposals must present fully developed joint study programmes, ready to run and to be advertised worldwide after their selection.

HOW DOES AN EMJM LOOK LIKE?

Fixed Grant Agreement of 74 months independently from the length of the master

Commitment to enroll a certain number of students per project

At least 4 master editions lasting 1 to 2 academic years (60, 90,120 ECTS)


Start of the 1st edition no later than the academic year following the year of project selection

At least 2 study periods in 2 countries (of which at least one in an EU Member State or a third country associated to the Programme)

Geographical balance of students: no more than 10% of total scholarships per project awarded to students of the same nationality





ERASMUS MUNDUS DESIGN MEASURES

TAKING PART AS AN ORGANISATION



Open to any public or private organisation worldwide

Applications can be submitted by any eligible HEI worldwide

- HEIs in EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme: valid ECHE
- ✓ HEIs in third countries not associated to the Programme: should commit to
 ECHE principles in the Partnership Agreement
