
WHAT ARE PARTNERSHIPS FOR COOPERATION?

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Who can apply?

- Organisations established in EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme can either participate as the coordinator of the project or as a partner organisation.
- A Cooperation Partnership is a transnational project and involves minimum three organisations

from three different EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme

Priorities addressed

- Cooperation Partnerships must address either:
- at least one horizontal priority and/or
- at least one specific priority relevant to the field of education, training, youth and sport that is mostly impacted.





WHAT IS AN EMJM?

A high-level integrated & transnational study programme at MA level

A Master programme of excellence open to all disciplines

Delivered by an international consortium of HEIs from different countries worldwide & other partners

Offering high-level scholarships to excellent students worldwide



REQUIREMENTS OF EMJM

- a jointly designed fully integrated curriculum

- a **consortium of at least three HEIs** from three different countries

- international outreach to attract excellent students worldwide

- compulsory physical mobility for all enrolled students

- contribution of scholars/guest lecturers

- delivery of a joint degree or multiple degrees



EMJM

At application stage EMJM proposals must present fully developed joint study programmes, ready to run and to be advertised worldwide after their selection.



HOW DOES AN EMJM LOOK LIKE?

Fixed Grant Agreement of 74 months independently from the length of the master

Commitment to enroll a certain number of students per project

At least 4 master editions lasting 1 to 2 academic years (60, 90,120 ECTS)


Start of the 1st edition no later than the academic year following the year of project selection

At least 2 study periods in 2 countries (of which at least one in an EU Member State or a third country associated to the Programme)

Geographical balance of students: no more than 10% of total scholarships per project awarded to students of the same nationality



EMJM FUNDING RULES





Implementation costs of the study programme

Unit cost per enrolled student of 750€ /month
 € 750 x n° of months x n° of enrolled students (cap of 100 enrolled students – but consortia are welcome to commit for higher numbers)
 => max. amount per project: 1.800.000 €

Same unit cost for scholarship holders and non-scholarship holders

Same unit cost for students from EU Member States, third countries associated to the Programme and third countries not associated to the Programme



ERASMUS MUNDUS JOINT MASTER STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

At student level:

> Full Scholarship to cover subsistence, installation and travel + fee waiver

A single unit cost per scholarship holder
 € 1400 x number of months (min. 1 academic year - max. 24 months)
 => max. amount per student: 33 600 Euros

At project level:

€ 1400 x number of months x number of students (cap of 60 students per EMJM project) => max. amount per project: 2,016,000 Euros per grant

=> Same unit cost for students from EU Member States, third countries associated to the Programme and third countries not associated to the Programme

At student level:

Contribution based on individual needs of students:
 10 different unit costs varying between € 3.000 – € 60.000
 => if below € 3000: to be covered by institutional costs

At project level:

Awarded at contracting stage:

- 0, 1 or 2 units costs of € 60 000
- => max. amount per project: € 120 000
- => For all enrolled students (scholarship holders and non-scholarship holders)

EU Grant: single lump sum contribution of 55.000,00 € (for costs linked to the activities necessary to set up the new joint master programme – meetings and conferences; studies/surveys; accreditation procedures; travel and lodging expenses; staff costs; administrative procedures....)

The award of an EMDM does not imply automatic funding under EMJM.



WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

EU member states and third countries associated to the programme

As a general rule, participants in Erasmus+ projects must be established in an EU Member State or third country associated to the Programme.

•Third countries associated to the programme: Iceland, Liechtenstein, North Macedonia, Norway, Serbia and Turkey

Third countries not associated to the programme

OVERARCHING PRIORITIES

- Digital transformation and data technologies- smart, digital technology in the poorest countries by building Digital transformation foundations for digital skills
- Sustainable, growth and jobs- foundational skills, 'soft' skills (e.g. problem solving, communication), and Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Maths (STEAM), education and employability
- Migration and mobility- making education systems more equitable, inclusion and Migration and Mobility diversity
- Governance, peace and human development- laying the foundations for strengthening active citizenship and building specific expertise of future policy-makers

HOW TO APLLY?

Applications are processed by the Education, Audiovisual and Culture Executive Agency (EACEA) of the European Commission. The organisation coordinating the Capacity Building project submits the application to EACEA which evaluates and selects the projects.

Organisations wishing to apply for the EACEA action are required to submit their application online to the EACEA using the correct electronic form and including all requested annexes. Applications sent by post, courier service, fax or email will not be accepted.

Application package

The application form is structured in 3 parts:

- Part A Administrative Forms Contains general information about the project, data on the applicant organisation and contact persons
- Part B* Technical description & annexes Contains the narrative part of the project, the work packages, milestones & deliverables. Detailed budget table is an annex of Part B
- Part C Administrative forms Tick boxes related to the proposal's general objective(s) and indicators specific to the CBHE action (N° of impacted students, N° of new study programmes, N° of involved/trained staff, etc.)

*Prepare Part B in advance and upload it together with the mandatory annexes


